



# Пе is Risen! Пе is Gruly Risen! Alleluia!!



HIS IS THE DAY which the Lord hath made; let us be glad and rejoice therein." All the days are the Lord's, for He is the Creator of time, but He is said to have made this day in a special way because on this day He

completed the work of our redemption. And since this is the work of God par excellence, the day on which He terminated it is the greatest of days...On this day the humanity of Christ rejoiced, the Mother of Christ rejoiced, the disciples of Christ rejoiced, heaven and earth rejoiced, and even hell itself was an unwilling witness to this joy. The sun shone more brightly on this day in order to glorify the Lord on the day of His triumph, while on the day of His passion and death it had been obscured. On witnessing the suffering of Jesus, the skies were darkened, but on this day they are resplendent as He emerges victorious from the tomb. To appreciate the mystery of this day, consider how the Savior, when the day of His passion was ended, descended to hell with the same love with which He had ascended to the cross. The Redeemer descends into hell clothed in clarity and fortitude, and at His entrance the night was made light and the lamentations ceased on seeing the Savior there. Then the tormented ones began to ask: "Who is this, so terrible, so powerful, and so resplendent? Never was seen a man like this in our hell. Never before has the world sent to these caverns a man such as this. He is holy, not a sinner; He is a judge, not a criminal. Where were our guards when this conquerer broke down the doors and entered by force? Who can He be? If He were a guilty person, He would not be so daring; if He were stained with sin, He would not shine forth so resplendently. But if He is God, what has He to do with hell? If He is man, how can He be so daring?" There in limbo

were gathered together all the souls of the just who from the beginning of the world until that moment had departed from this life. There was the holy patriarch, Noe, who had built the ark to preserve the human race. There was Abraham, the father of the faithful... There was his obedient son, Isaac, who had carried on his own shoulders the wood of the sacrifice over which he was to have been slain...There also as newcomers were John the

Baptist and the holy Simeon, who did not wish to leave the world until his eyes had seen the salvation of the world. There was the poor Lazarus of the Gospel, who through his sufferings and patience merited to be a member of such a noble company. This army of holy souls had been longing for this day...And you, Jeremias, who were stoned for this Lord, close the book of lamentations which you wrote at seeing Jerusalem destroyed and the temple of God demolished, for now you see another and more beautiful temple, raised up again after three days. When the ancients saw their darkness brightened, their exile ended, and the beginning of their glory, what tongue could explain their feelings? Seeing themselves led out of captivity, they could chant: "Let us sing to the Lord, for He is gloriously magnified... The Lord is my strength and my praise, and He is become salvation to me." With what deep sentiments the father of the human race, prostrate at the feet of his Savior, could say: "Thou hast come at last, beloved Lord, to remedy my fault. Thou hast come to keep Thy promise and hast not forgotten those who hoped in Thee."
