Mass Schedule June 29th – July 12th

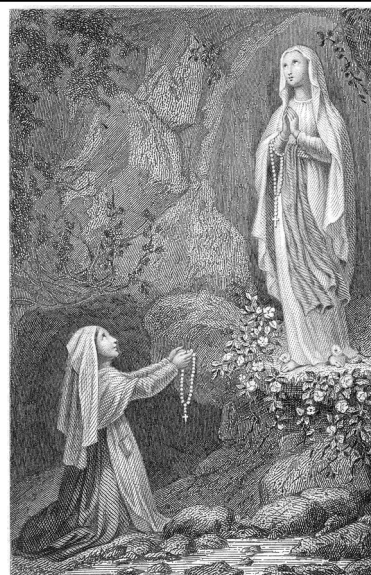
While I am gone, there will be Mass at Our Lady of Lourdes Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, & Friday at 6:30 am. Wednesday Mass will be at 12:10 pm. The Saturdays I am gone (4th & 11th) we will have Mass at 9am at Our Lady of Lourdes. We will not have Mass at Holy Family Oratory on the 11th. The Sunday Mass schedule is the same with the exception that there is no Mass at Holy Family Oratory on July 5th & 12th.

Confession Schedule June 29th – July 12th

Confession will be available *after* the daily 6:30 am Mass until 7:30 am. Please note that confession *will not be available* before the 6:30 am Mass. Confession will also be available before the 12:10 pm, and Saturday and Sunday Masses.

† **ATTENTION PLEASE:** We are asking that everyone treat the hillside grotto-area as set aside for Our Lady as a place of prayer and reflection. We especially ask that children not be allowed to be alone here or play in this area. Please keep in mind that the fountain uses a pump to circulate spring water, passing it through a sediment filter. This pump and fountain can easily be damaged (e.g., by children throwing rocks inside the bowl). Keep in mind that although the fountain water is refreshed frequently with spring water, it is not constantly being refreshed. Thus we ask that no one play with the water or wash hands or face with it over the bowl. Even though it is passed through a sediment filter, we ask everyone to help us keep it clean.

"We must not be too apt to flatter ourselves that we possess any special virtue. Our chastity may be the result of an absence of opportunities or temptations; and in like manner, our patience may proceed from a phlegmatic temperament, or be dictated by worldly and not by Christian wisdom. This can be said of many other virtues in which we are liable to make the same mistake. We must study this doctrine well, that the true Christian virtues are "born not of blood, nor of the will of the flesh, nor of the will of man, but of God" (John 1:13), that is, that they are not the work either of the desires, passions or reason of man, but proceed from God as their First Principle and return to God as their Last End. This knowledge is necessary for us, so that we may not imagine ourselves to be virtuous when we are not, nor think ourselves better than others when we see them falling into sin."
