

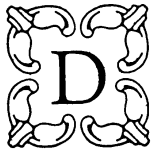

CONFIRMATION

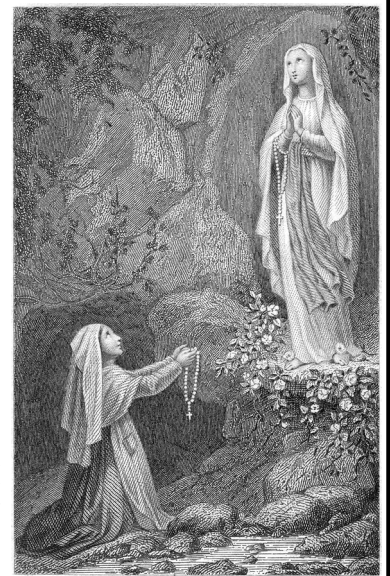
As previously announced, Bishop Iffert will administer the Sacrament of Confirmation **Saturday, April 18th at 12:00 pm**, here at Our Lady of Lourdes. Confirmation will be in the *Traditional Rite of 1962*, in Latin. Those eligible to receive Confirmation are those who have been baptized Catholic, *ages 12 on up*. If you are an adult and have been baptized Catholic, and have not been confirmed, you are eligible as well. We will have **2 mandatory** classes for Confirmation for all being Confirmed. **The classes will be on Sundays, March 22nd and March 29th at 2pm** in the undercroft of the Church. For the class on March 29th, your sponsor must be present as well. A sponsor must be at least 16 years old, have been initiated in the Catholic Church through the 3 sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and the Holy Eucharist, be in good standing with the Church, and display a visible commitment to living out the Catholic Faith and have the ability and intention to carry out his responsibility as a spiritual guide in your life. Please note that a sponsor cannot be a parent of the one to be Confirmed.

BECAUSE OF THIS SUBLIME DIGNITY which God conferred on His most faithful servant, the Church has always most highly honored and praised blessed Joseph next to his spouse, the Virgin Mother of God, and has besought his intercession in times of trouble. And now therefore, when in these most troublesome times the Church is beset by enemies on every side, and is weighed down by calamities so heavy that ungodly men assert that the gates of hell have at length prevailed against her, the venerable prelates of the whole Catholic world have presented to the Sovereign Pontiff their own petitions and those of the faithful committed to their charge, praying that he would deign to constitute St. Joseph Patron of the Church. And this time their prayer and desire was renewed by them even more earnestly at the Sacred Ecumenical Council of the Vatican.
